The National Youth Dialogue (NYD) on Leadership, Innovation & Entrepreneurship



The National Youth Dialogue 2020/2021 (NYD) on Leadership, Innovation and Entrepreneurship is an annual national youth engagement exercise led by UNDP Sri Lanka. This year's NYD held from 16 February to 18 March, UNV Sri Lanka and UN Volunteers contributed by discussing youth volunteerism and sharing knowledge and skills.

During the third week of the NYD, UN Youth Volunteers Oshan and Soyeon hosted a session on how to develop online learning skills. They shared their knowledge and experience and introduced a variety of tools to enhance students' e-learning.

On 9th March, UN Volunteer Shenaal from UNV Sri Lanka presented on the 2030 Agenda and the role of volunteerism in achieving the 17 SDGs. During the discussion, the speakers invited from Volunteering Involving Organisations discussed various topics around youth volunteerism - the critical roles of young volunteers in the Decade of Action, benefits of volunteering engagement to youth, and envisioning the future of youth volunteerism.
